Applique	It is decorative work in which one or more pieces of fabric are sewn or stuck onto a larger background fabric to create pictures or patterns.	Overlapping stitch	This is a hand sewing stitch that wraps the working thread around the edge of fabric or seams.
Accurate	Correct, exact and without any mistakes	Reinforce	In sewing, this means you are going over an area with stitches a few times to make it stronger. This might be at corners, curves or areas that you need to trim closely too.

Key Knowledge

- Cushions were once made from hard, solid materials and available only to the wealthiest of families
- Cushions come in all different designs, fabrics and shapes.
- Fold the fabric in half making sure that the side that will be on the inside is facing out. Draw the base shape. Cut out the shape of your design, leaving a little extra space between the line you are cutting and the actual body. Add your applique to one side using over stitch. Turn the material inside out and sew along the edge of your fabric until there is only a small gap left. Make sure you turn the cushion back round before you add the stuffing and sew up the gap.
