### Key Knowledge

When we are saying what fruits we like, we say "J'aime" which means "I like" + then the noun.

I like apples -----> J'aime les pommes

We can easily say we don't like a certain fruit by replacing "J'aime" for "Je n'aime pas" which means "I don't like"

I don't like apples -----> Je n'aime les bananes
