<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A typical breakfast for French children would involve pastries such as pain au chocolats and brioche. Children would also drink hot chocolate too! • If something tastes nice, French people would say 'miam, miam!', which means 'yummy!' • The sound 'é' as in déjeuner, grillé, café, thé sounds like 'eh'. • We can begin to build compound sentences by using the connective 'et' meaning 'and'. This is pronounced 'eh'. • The 'qu' spelling in the words 'quarante' and 'cinquante' is pronounced with a 'k'
