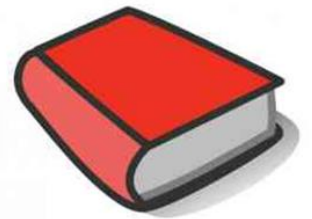
Welcome, as ever to our weekly newsletter.

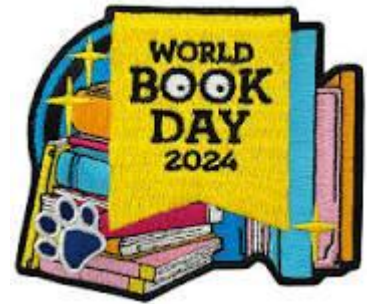

World Book Day - 7th March

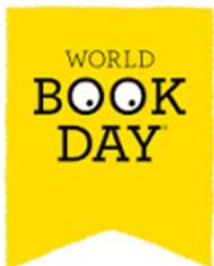
Just a reminder that next Thursday is World Book Day and we will be celebrating in school in a number of ways.

In school, as well as our usual reading and book activities, we will be buddy reading, where older and younger children read together for pleasure. Also, we will be appointing Book reps in Y1-Y6, these will be children who will listen to recommendations from other children in class and then discuss with the teachers about what books they would like to have more of in class. The money raised from our sponsored read will help to pay for new books.



We are holding our usual 'stay and read' session, for family members to come into school and enjoy books with the children. This will be after registration (8.50am) on Tuesday 5th March until 9.30. If you would like to attend please come to the School Office (after dropping off your child) and sign in, and then you will be shown to your child's class when they are ready.

On Thursday (World Book day itself) we will be holding our Character Parade, in school we will look at costumes in the morning but then families are welcome from 2.15 to come to the hall and watch the children parade on stage in their costumes. Carlton Friends will be hosting refreshments and the Usborne Book Stall will be open. The parade will start at approximately 2.30 and will include prizes for best dressed and the World Book Day raffle draw. Each child will go home with a £1 book token. The book stall will be open after school in the hall, as last year, if you would like to buy books. (World Book Day Tokens can be accepted towards books over £2.99)

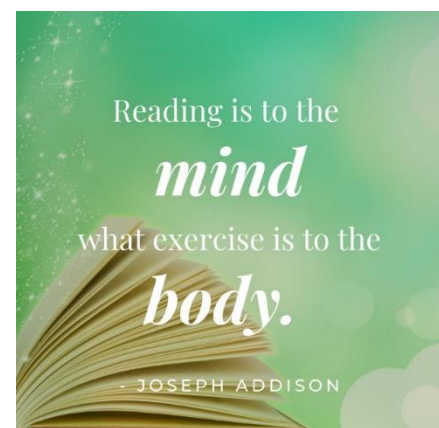

World Book Day 2024 Raffle

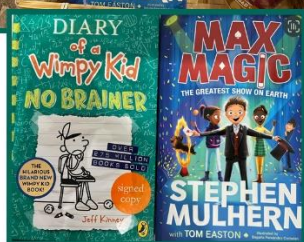
