<p>Ramadan</p> <p>Fasting</p> 	<p>Ramadan is the ninth month of the Muslim year, during which strict fasting is observed</p> <p>Fasting is not eating whilst it's light outside (sunrise to sunset)</p> <p>During Ramadan Muslims read the Qur'an, go to the mosque and pray more often. They donate money to charity and do good deeds in their community.</p> <p>The festival marking the end of Ramadan is Id ul Fitr</p>	<p>Resurrection</p>  <p>Disciples</p>	<p>Easter is a special and sacred time for Christians because it is the celebration of Jesus' resurrection.</p> <p>Resurrection is a return to life after death.</p> <p>Easter reminds Christians that God had resurrected his son and that he has gone to be with him in heaven.</p> <p>The stories of Holy week and Easter are special or holy for Christian people because they are about turning sadness to happiness</p> <p>Disciples are the twelve original followers of Jesus Christ who are a big part of the Easter Story</p>
