Colour wheel

A diagram used in art to represent colours and their relationships to one another

Tertiary

There are six tertiary colours. On the colour wheel, they sit between the primary and secondary colour they are mixed from.

Base colour

First layer of paint that is applied to a surface or canvas as the foundation for a painting.

Bold

Strong and noticeable to the eye










Key Knowledge

- ⇒ Artists layer paint to add texture and detail
- ⇒ Foreground appears closer so objects should be larger here
- ⇒ Background appears further away so objects should be smaller
- ⇒ Rivers are moving bodies of water so we use lots of texture to create a movement effect
