### Key Knowledge

- Achieving a good French accent in 3 steps; don't pronounce the 'h', note silent last consonants and short vowel sounds.
- é (cheek bones go up and smile)
- è (chin goes down)
- When using c'est you always use the masculine form of the adjective. For now, to avoid adjectival agreements, use c'est with plurals too.
- When ordering more than one of an item, be careful when writing plurals e.g. 2 ham sandwiches is 2 sandwichs au jambon NOT 2 sandwich au jambons.
- tion as in addition is pronounced 'ssION' not 'shun'.
