### Key Knowledge

- It is interesting to compare pictures of French markets with what we may be familiar with. French market stalls are beautifully decorated and the variety of fresh produce is typically much bigger than in England.
- France uses the euro as their currency so children will become familiar with the euro symbol.
- 'ou' in 'voudrais' is pronounced 'oo'.
- 'ais' in 'voudrais' is pronounced 'eh'.
- J'ai (I have) comes from the verb 'avoir', which means 'to have'.
- French markets are often a cross between a farmers market and a traders market. Many stalls offer local produce that has come straight from the farm.
