Key Knowledge

- To join clay, score/ mark each side, add slip to both sides and secure by pushing clay gently from one side to the other.
- To create a pinch pot, gently press your thumb into the clay to create a hole with an even base and sides.
- To make a tile, evenly roll the clay by using two slats (one either side of the clay) and a rolling pin.
- Keep the clay moving so that it does not get stuck onto the board.
- After taking a photo of each ceramic masterpiece... we squash it!
