<b>Trim</b>	This tool crops a selection of an audio track by deleting the part you do not want.

**Key knowledge:**

- Sound data can be recorded on an external device and inputted into a computer system. They can then be saved as a digital audio file to be used later.
- Saved audio data can be edited to improve it for any reason.
- Two or more sets of audio data can be combined to produce a final version and then exported to be presented in the form of a podcast.
- Lots of audio is copyrighted which means that it is limited by the owner/producer to who can use the data.
- People create podcasts for many reasons. Lots of them are intended to teach or entertain people about specific things.
