Key Knowledge
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> We use two main verbs (jouer and faire) when we talk about which sports we play or do. We use jouer for sports that we play, eg; je joue le football and faire for sports that we do, eg; je fais le judo. We can build up conversation by using the question stem, 'Qu'est-ce que tu fais + a day'. This would mean, 'what are you doing on (Monday)?' We can learn the different day of the week to change the question ending. The word 'agenda' is used in both the French and English language. We call this a cognate.
