The UK in is Europe. The UK's climate is temperate. This means it gets cool winters and warm summers.

Brazil in in South America. The capital city is Brazilia. Brazil's climate is tropical. This means it is hot, usually wet and humid.

The Amazon is the world's largest tropical rainforest. The Amazon is found in South America, spanning across Brazil, Bolivia, Peru, Ecuador, Colombia, Venezuela, Guyana, Suriname and French Guiana.

Brazil speak Portuguese. The population is 216 million compared with the UK's 68 million. Brazil is the 5th largest country by area and 6th biggest country by population. The most famous landmark of Brazil is located in Rio de Janeiro. The Christ the Redeemer statue overlooks the city and Sugarloaf mountain
