<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Christians all belong to a group and the most important person to them is Jesus. • They belong to Jesus and Jesus belongs to them. • The cross or crucifix is a symbol of belonging for Christians. • Allah is the Muslim word for 'God' this is the most important thing Muslim's belong to. • Pilgrims circle around the Ka'aba at Hajj, this is a sign of belonging in Islam. • Jews gather together to celebrate Shabbat. • Jewish symbols of belonging are Kiddush cup, bread broken and shared together, candle lit at the beginning of the meal, blessing said together. • Sikh's wear 5 symbols to show that they belonged to Khalsa. • The 5 K's are Kesh, Kanga, Kara, Kirpan, Kaccha.
