Key Knowledge

- Countries that end in "e" are feminine - Eg; La France, L'Allemagne - all other countries are masculine.
 - England: **L'Angleterre** = land of the Angles.
 - If they want to say 'of France', it is **de la France** but 'of Portugal' is **du Portugal** as Portugal is masculine.
 - Languages around the world have come from different origins and the main languages spoken across Europe are referred to as Indo-European. These are split into sub-groups.
 - Nationalities begin with lower case letters when used as an adjective, accompanied by a noun e.g. **Je suis un garçon italien.**
 - When nationality is used on its own (as a proper noun) it takes a capital letter e.g. **Je suis Italien.** (male)
Je suis Italienne. (female)
- Literally 'I am an Italian person.'
- anglais** (m)
anglaise (f)
