Welcome as ever to our weekly newsletter - the penultimate one of this school year! Suddenly we have only 5 school days left. Where is the time going?

Today:

- Reports: End of Year Reports will be coming home to parents this afternoon. We hope you enjoy reading them! My staff have really done a super job in providing personal reports capturing some really special information. Please do share them with your child(ren). - Move up Morning 1 – internal transition day. Today we held the first of our two move up mornings. All pupils spent time with their teachers, teaching assistants and class mates for next year. Within the day we welcomed some of our new reception pupils with the other half coming on Monday (move Up day 2). We also welcomed some new pupils (and new families) to school for their move up morning to meet their new classes too. Welcome to the Team!
- This evening we have a very special evening for Year 6 children – who are attending 'Leaver's Fest 2024' – the weather forecast is interesting!

Other news this week:

- Brayton transition: Our final Year 6/Year 7 transition has been taking place this week, with some of the cohort attending Brayton Academy for the week. We are pleased to hear it has been going well!

A message from Year 2/ Hawthorn class: Non Uniform day on Tuesday

*We have been learning about how to care for others in RE. Some of the ways we can do this are: giving to charity; being kind to anyone (not just your friends) and following the Golden Rule of "treat others how you would like to be treated". After we watched Newsround, we wanted to do something to help people in Jamaica and other places in the Caribbean affected by Hurricane Beryl. **So on Tuesday we will be having a non-uniform day** to raise money to give to the British Red Cross who are helping the people in need. The **suggested donation is £1** but please give whatever you can.*

Good to be Gold celebration 7- I was delighted to announce in assembly on Monday that we have reached our target of 60 golden points - this means we have triggered our 7th Good to Be Gold celebration of the academic year. This is the first time we have ever had 7 celebrations in one year which just means we are having even more good behaviour which is great news.

This celebration is booked in for Monday 15th July afternoon, after our second 'move up morning'. As usual, the children will get to select 2 activities from a wide range. The children have made their choices of activities and I informed them this morning that we are having the celebration on Monday. Please note: if they have chosen a sporting one they should wear their PE kit on Monday – please ask your children as they know which activities they have chosen!)

This time round it has only taken 5 weeks to hit our target . Children who have received two sanctions or less in this time frame have earned the privilege to take part in the full celebration. For the minority of children who have not remediated 'gold' in this period they miss a proportion of the celebration , directly linked to the number of sanctions received and take part in a Reflective session instead.
