- now have fibre cabling available to school so have substantially upgraded our internet connection speed – this is very exciting and useful.
- accessed financial support for new LED lighting for our external lights and our 2 TCU/Portacabins, greatly improving these classroom facilities.

<u>PE Kits.</u> A reminder that children should wear their PE Kit for the days when they are doing PE in school. PE kits should be as per the Uniform Policy:

- Red collared t-shirt or Red plain t-shirt
- Black or dark grey shorts (or tracksuit bottoms, joggers, or leggings)
- Tracksuit top, fleece, jumper or 'zippy' ideally these should red, black, or dark grey and should be plain (e.g. no large logo on – it is not a fashion show!) In the short term a plain top is appropriate.
- Trainers or pumps (suitable for outdoor use)

<u>School shows/Productions.</u> We think that children having the chance to sing, act and perform in front of others is a super experience. So, this year we have planned to our three usual timings of performances:

- Christmas the youngest 3 classes (Alnwick, Bamburgh and Caernarfon) will be performing a Christmas themed show.
- Just before Easter our middle classes (Dover and Edinburgh) will have their performance,
- Our oldest classes, Warwick and Windsor have their turn in the summer.


